Addictions Recovery Ministry Report

The Addictions Recovery Ministry (ARM) is a specialized ministry of the Episcopal Diocese of Louisiana as well as a local affiliate of the Recovery Ministries of the Episcopal Church. This ministry reaches out on behalf of the Church to welcome recovering people into the Episcopal community and helps recovering Episcopalians find a home within the organized Church. The Recovery Ministry works within the diocese to provide education, guidance and support for families and parishes struggling with, or wishing to learn more about, addiction. The term "addiction" includes a relationship with any activity or substance which interferes with healthy functioning - alcohol, drugs, relationships, sex, work, gambling or food for example. Currently we offer Celebration of Life in Recovery events in parishes throughout the diocese, a Women's Recovery Weekend in January and our annual Recovery Weekend for both men and women in August at the Episcopal Conference Center in Robert, Louisiana, all of which allow a variety of people to come together as Christians in twelve-step recovery. All events are open to all people in, or wanting to be in, recovery, and to those who love them. Our desire is not to be dogmatic or exclude anyone in their spiritual search but to live out the acceptance and love taught by Jesus.

St. Margaret's has hosted weekly AA meetings on Tuesday nights for 20+ years with an average weekly attendance of 20 in 2023. This group has donated a percentage of their 'basket collection', $(1/6^{th} - \$375 \text{ in } 2023)$ to St. M's as well as purchasing coffee cups and Splenda which are shared with the church.

Future Wish List

- 1) Host more Recovery-oriented group meetings (AA, Al-Anon, NA, GA, etc)
- 2) Parish membership in RMEC (\$125 annual Annual Membership for a Parish Includes one sample packet per year of all current RMEC literature and online PDF access to all current RMEC pamphlets.
- 3) 1 or more additional Parish members in the Recovery Ministry and on the ARM Commission.
- 4) Monthly 12-Step Eucharists or at least a resumption of our '5th Wednesday' Holy Eucharist incorporating the 12 Steps at our 5:30 pm healing service. Fr Tommy used this liturgy at two 12 Step Eucharists during the Wild Goose Festival in Hot Springs, NC, in July of 2017, and people loved it! Hardly any bulletins needed to come back with Fr Tommy since people wanted to bring them back home to their churches. 5th Wednesdays in 2023 are Mar 29, May 31, Aug 30, and Nov 29.
- 5) Resume the 'Recovery Sunday' during Eastertide as suggested @ Diocesan Convention, using the 12 Step Liturgy developed by the Diocesan Recovery Ministry.

New members join the group at the beginning of the year. At St. Margaret's, each year begins in January and members register each year in November.

Endowment Fund Committee Report

The Endowment Fund Committee was created to enhance the financial stability and future of our faith community for generations to come. The long-term vision includes the support of our church and ministries, both present and future. Together we can accomplish what we cannot do alone. Combining our resources, we can help grow St. Margaret's into the future.

The original work establishing the Endowment Fund Committee was approved by the Vestry in June of 2018. However, with personnel changes and covid, the actual staffing of the committee was formally completed in October of 2023. The Vestry approved three individuals: Maureen Westgard as Chair, Jack Warner as Treasurer and Keith Duplechain as Secretary for the committee. In addition, the Rector and Senior Warden are ex-officio members without votes.

The committee began work that month, meeting with the Episcopal Church Foundation (ECF) to establish an account, review the original investment policy, and provide the information and forms required for the investment of the funds. The ECF provides management and recordkeeping of our funds and secures the money managers who do the actual investing. The ECF has over \$549 million under management and 336 clients with a total of 426 accounts. Funds range in size from \$10,000 to \$20+ million in assets. St. Margaret's Endowment Fund was formally funded on November 30th with \$10,000 from our Columbarium account.

In November and December, we also had discussions with ECF regarding the education and marketing materials for the fund. We are researching what other nonprofits do around planned giving programs, how they approach marketing to their members and how they do outreach with potential donors.

During 2024 we will announce the formation of a Legacy Society for St. Margaret's and invite the congregation to become founding members. A Legacy Society recognizes and honors those who make a commitment to St. Margaret's in their estate plans or annual giving. Please look for announcements in the newsletter and service bulletin, and on our website, about the importance of this special type of stewardship that serves your family, as well as the church. We look forward to building a successful planned giving program at St. Margaret's in 2024.

Kidcam

At Kidcam, camp isn't just something we do, it's all we do. And we strive to do it better than anyone else. Creating meaningful summer experiences for children ages 5 through 13 is our focus 365 days a year.

We pride ourselves on creating a welcoming, safe, and supportive summer family where every child is treasured for what makes him or her unique. Through our long-standing traditions and values, we create a sense of belonging that gives children the confidence to be who they are. While enjoying a summer of fun, adventure, and wonder, Kidcam campers are made to feel that they are a part of something truly special.

Kidcam Camps is blessed to be able to partner with St. Margaret's to provide Summer and Holiday camp to the Baton Rouge community. This past summer Kidcam had over 165 different campers, from different backgrounds, walk through the doors at St. Margaret's and 62 different campers for Holiday Camp. During Summer 2023 Kidcam averaged about 80 campers a week and 20 campers per day during the holidays. We were also able to donate Kidcam's Ultimate Summer Giveaway @ St. Margaret's valued at \$1600.00 to the St. Margaret's Follies silent auction. 2023 was a record breaker for Kidcam @ St. Margaret's Episcopal Church.

We have not seen enrollment number like this previous Summer since the inception of Kidcam and St. Margaret's Partnership, we are extremely proud our St. Margaret's Camp Director, Brynne Babin as this was the first year for her as the Camp Director and these numbers were a true testament to her leadership at camp. La Mesa Latino/Hispanic Ministry Report

Spring:

In January 2023, La Mesa began our first cycle of Spanish and English classes. By the end of the cycle, we had a handful of faithful students – Native Spanish speakers learning English and Native English speakers learning Spanish. Our bilingual masses and festivals were successful and had 30-50 attendees depending on the event. One significant partnership we developed was with Maria, a local Hispanic woman who owns a catering business and who we pay weekly to cook meals for La Mesa. Everyone enjoys Maria's meals, and we believe we are honoring La Mesa's relational mission by using our resources to partner with and invest in a local Hispanic business.

Summer:

We had some success over the summer hosting some small conversational gatherings. Some of our St. Margaret's leaders were invited to join a team in the Episcopal Diocese of Louisiana that is dedicated to the growth of Latino and Hispanic ministry in local parishes and beyond. That work is ongoing. One thing we have accomolished is filming a video that highlights existing Latino and Hispanic Ministry at St. Mark's in Harvey and St. Margaret's. The film was shared at the annual convention and the footage will also be used to create an additional video that can be used to raise money for La Mesa. Other St. Margaret's members went to a conference in California about strategic church and ministry growth. Danielle spent time in the summer studying Spanish in Costa Rica.

Fall/Winter

Our second cycle of classes began in August 2023 and we immediately grew from a handful of consistent Native Spanish speakers to 20+ Hispanic students weekly. We divide students into two classes, an advanced class and a beginner/intermediate class. Mac took over teaching responsibilities for the advanced class and Danielle and Leslie

are teaching the beginner/intermediate class. The Native English speakers now partner with the advanced class which includes verbal practice and feedback in both language. At the end of 2023, we had one of our largest events when 50+ people attended Las Posadas on December 22nd.

Future, 2024

We are currently beginning a partnership with the New Neighbor Project, an organization in New Orleans that trains and resources ESL facilitators. With their help, we will recruit and train additional teachers for La Mesa, beginning with some LSU students and interested members of St. Margaret's. This will allow us to expand the number of classes and levels we offer during our Sunday night La Mesa gatherings. We hope with additional facilitators our leadership team can put more energy into developing a good foundation (structure, funding, etc.) so that La Mesa remains healthy as it continues to grow. We have began our third cycle of classes with 20+ Hispanic students and 2 class levels, but anticipate having additional facilitators and more levels beginning in February.

Labyrinth, Meditation Garden and Creation Care

As a part of contemplative prayer practices, during Lent, Centering prayer was offered on Sunday afternoons. Parishioners experienced silence interspersed with Taizé music and the reading of scripture. Other opportunities for prayer include the use of our beautiful canvas labyrinth.

Many hours have been spent caring for the green spaces on our property at St Margaret's this year. Dedicated parishioners have donated their time and treasure to the upkeep of our Meditation Garden, the columbarium area, and the church entrance.

This year we focused on practices to engage in a deeper relationship with God's created world as a space for healing, spiritual formation, reflection, and prayer.

We celebrated the Season of Creation Sept 1 - Oct 4 using liturgies calling us to be one with God and all of creation.

In collaboration with Youth and Families ministry, "Exploring God in Nature" events were offered to our young people.

We began a move from Styrofoam and plastic to the use of sustainable products to care for and honor God's creation. Volunteers have formed a green team to wash dishes and purchase biodegradable products.

On October 4, we celebrated St Francis Day with the blessing of animals in our outdoor chapel.

Using the program, Living in an Icon by Robert Gottfried, several parishioners participated in an ongoing study of building a relationship with God, each other, and our non-human neighbors in creation. The program is a year-long journey designed for small group nature contemplation. So far, we have covered aspects of waking up, noticing, delight, surprise, wonder, appreciation, and respect of all that we encounter in nature bringing us back in touch with Gods creation and Gods presence in the world.

This initial group planned an Advent Nature retreat to include more participation in the program. The feedback from the retreat was positive.

St Margaret's has representation on the Diocesan Environmental Commission working with others across the diocese to expand knowledge of creation care initiatives of the National Episcopal Church policy, education, worship and field experience opportunities.

Pastoral Care Team Report 2023

The mission of St. Margaret's Pastoral Care Team is to provide a ministry of support, hope, and caring so that everyone in the congregation feels supported in both difficult as well as joyful times in their lives. This year, the Pastoral Care Team began with new members and a new team leader, Andrea Butler. Below is a list of the major activities of the Pastoral Care Team for 2023.

- A mission and guidelines were developed for the team along with processes for electronic documentation in an effort to streamline paperwork.
- In early 2023, team members participated in an in-person training session on Eucharistic Visitation which provided the necessary skills and guidelines for visits. For visitation assignments for long-term visitees, pairs of team members were assigned to visit the same person each time. This allowed for consistency and rapport- and trust-building among the Eucharistic Visitors and the visitee.
- Overall, approximately 32 Eucharistic visits were made during 2023.
- In addition to Eucharistic visitation, pastoral care phone calls were made to offer support and prayers to those in need.
- Another in-person meeting was held in September to discuss the possibility of expanding Pastoral Care initiatives beyond Eucharistic visitation for the future, such as a card ministry.

Each member of the 2023 Pastoral Care Team has served with exemplary dedication, compassion, and care for those in need; the Team is seeking new members who exhibit the same qualifications. In 2024 and beyond, the Pastoral Care Team will continue to explore ways to expand and serve the people of St. Margaret's.

Prayer Shawls and Crosses

The goal of the Prayer Shawl Ministry is to provide prayer shawls (either knitted or crocheted) to all persons in need of care due to financial problems, spousal problems, problems with children, medical problems, or just life situations where a person needs to know that someone cares about them, and that God loves them. While a prayer shawl is being made, prayers are said for the person, whoever they may be. There is never any cost for the prayer shawl. In the year of 2023, prayer shawls have continued to be given to those that needed them. Since the formation of this ministry our prayer shawls have been sent all over the United States.

Thanks to a collaborative effort between St. Margaret's, St. James Place Retirement Community and others, we now have seven people (two expert, three returning to crochet and two beginners who regularly attend the Tuesday 10:30 meeting of fellowship and sharing of ideas while crocheting prayer shawls. The group is open and welcomes all who are interested in the ministry.

After keeping the supply of shawls up to needed level, ideas are explored for new projects and designs which challenge all levels of crocheters to grow in their skills. The most meaningful project was brought to the group by a parishioner knowing of a young boy starting chemo who would benefit from a shawl. Finding out that he loved superheroes, a Spiderman shawl/cape and beanie were quickly made and delivered with much love.

The group also supported the winter gala fundraiser by donating beanies, candle decorations and dressy shawl. In addition to the prayer shawls, we also have crosses to send to those in need of care or encouragement. These small handheld crosses were made prayerfully by members of the parish. Each cross has a tag with the shield of St. Margaret's and the following explanation: "This little cross, fashioned of scraps of wood by hands that prayed for you, was never meant to adorn a wall. Rather, it is just the right size to hold in your hand as a reminder of how close the Lord is to you. From Isaiah 49:15-16

Stewardship Ministry

The Stewardship Ministry is responsible for planning and directing the annual stewardship appeal, working closely with the rector, the treasurer, and the Vestry's Finance Committee. For the past several years, we have partnered with The Episcopal Network for Stewardship (TENS) using the prescribed themes and materials:

2023 - Rooted in Abundance (\$262,500 is our goal. \$265,280 was generously pledged.)

2022 - More Than Enough (\$250,800 was our goal. \$250,000 was generously pledged.)

2021 - Every Perfect Gift (\$228,000 was pledged.)

The Stewardship campaign sets our operating budget for the upcoming year: to pay expenses, to support our ministries, our church property (utilities/upkeep), our rector and pastoral expenses, music, hospitality, fellowship, and a diocesan assessment. This year's campaign kicked off on Sunday, October 1, 2023. The in-gathering of pledge cards took place on Sunday, November 5, 2023. While not all pledge cards were received on this Sunday, our rector and dedicated members of the community reached out to families and individuals who had yet to pledge. We continued to see support and generous giving up until the end of 2023 to surpass our goal.
