I began attending St. Margaret's on a regular basis in 2008 when the average attendance at the 8:00 mass could be counted on one hand. Please look around now and do a quick count. We also have opportunities to serve in parish roles that support in other ways, from the children's ministry and adult Christian education, vestry, and those who are helping to bring us to a new vision of environmental responsibility. I have served on vestry and as Senior Warden, both life changing experiences. I strongly encourage you to step up as a candidate for vestry – we need them from the 8:00 congregation. Meanwhile, our lay eucharistic visitors bring the sacrament to those who cannot attend services in person. Andrea and I were privileged to bring communion to Dottie Smith, a long-time member, and her beloved family. What a wonderful experience!

We also have congregants who speak up and represent St. Margaret's and join with Fr. Tommy about issues in the outside community through various outreaches, from our La Mesa Latino ministry to supporting community endeavors including ties with Together Baton Rouge, Interfaith Fellowship, and Diocesan initiatives supporting inclusion and diversity.
