CHURCH PERIODICAL CLUB SUNDAY IS TODAY!

The Church Periodical Club is an independent, affiliated organization of the Executive Council of the Episcopal Church. Its work is dedicated to the worldwide ministry of the Printed Word and to the promotion of Christian ministry. Church Periodical Club (CPC) was founded over 100 years ago by Mary Jane Fargo in order to provide enrichment for lonely missionaries on the frontier. Prayer Books, books for seminarians, educational materials, medical textbooks, agricultural manuals and books for those in local and global mission are some of the publications The Church Periodical Club supplies. The Church Periodical Club operates at all levels of the Church - national, provincial, diocesan and parish. Two components of the CPC are the National Books Fund and Miles of Pennies. We will have a special collection for the Church Periodical Club on Pentecost, May 19. FEAST OF PENTECOST

Pentecost marks the powerful descent of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples, an event that changed the course of history and inaugurated a new era of the Church. In many Episcopal Churches, including ours, it's customary to wear red on Pentecost. Red not only represents the liturgical color of the day but also symbolizes the flames of fire that descended upon the disciples, as recounted in the Book of Acts. It's a visual reminder of the Spirit's presence among us, stirring our hearts and inspiring us to embrace the radical love and transformative power of God. Pentecost isn't just a day for passive observance; it's a celebration of the Spirit's active presence in our lives. So let's not only wear red as a symbol but also embrace the Spirit wholeheartedly. Let's open ourselves to the Spirit's movement, allowing Her to challenge our expectations, invigorate our worship, and propel us into new expressions of faith. This Pentecost, let's come together as a community ready to welcome the Spirit with open hearts and minds. Let's break free from the constraints of tradition and invite the Spirit to move within and among us, guiding us into deeper communion with God and one another. May this Pentecost be a joyful celebration of the Spirit's boundless love and unfailing presence in our lives.
