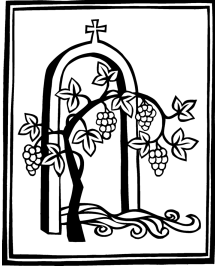

Its work is dedicated to the worldwide ministry of the Printed Word and to the promotion of Christian ministry. Church Periodical Club (CPC) was founded over 100 years ago by Mary Jane Fargo in order to provide enrichment for lonely missionaries on the frontier. Prayer Books, books for seminarians, educational materials, medical textbooks, agricultural manuals and books for those in local and global mission are some of the publications The Church Periodical Club supplies. The Church Periodical Club operates at all levels of the Church - national, provincial, diocesan and parish. Two components of the CPC are the National Books Fund and Miles of Pennies. We will have a special collection for the Church Periodical Club on Pentecost, May 19. OUTREACH OPPORTUNITY from Joan Weber, one of our seminarians

Recently, I had a conversation with a parishioner at St. Augustine's. Every Tuesday and Thursday Pat drives to St. Gerard Catholic Church on Plank Road to help provide meals for people who live with food insecurity. Pat also brings gift bags with toiletry items collected by the women of St. Augustine's. I asked Pat what got her started in this ministry and she told me that during COVID she had way too much time on her hands and asked God to guide her to a ministry that would make a difference in someone's life. Pat could not have imagined it was her own life that would be transformed. She did not anticipate the joy she would feel meeting people who come for a meal and a sense of belonging. So many have expressed gratitude for those toiletry gift bags that we hope to be able to double the number Pat can distribute. Would you join us in collecting items for this outreach ministry? Here's a list of things most frequently requested: Toilet paper, Bar soap, Soap holders, Wash cloths, Toothbrushes and Toothpaste for adults, Deodorant for men and women, Razors and Shaving cream for men and women, Shampoo, Hand sanitizer, Body lotion for men and women, dishwashing detergent, laundry detergent, Body wipes. We'll have a collection bin set up in the entry of Church and Michael and I will bring the donations with us to St. Augustine's. Thanks!
