The symbolism of a lay person being at the altar is significant, as it models orders (lay, deacon, priest) working together as we do in our daily lives. Minimum age requirement is third grade and there is no maximum. The Acolytes receive on-the-job training, facilitated by our verger, Lester Mut.
